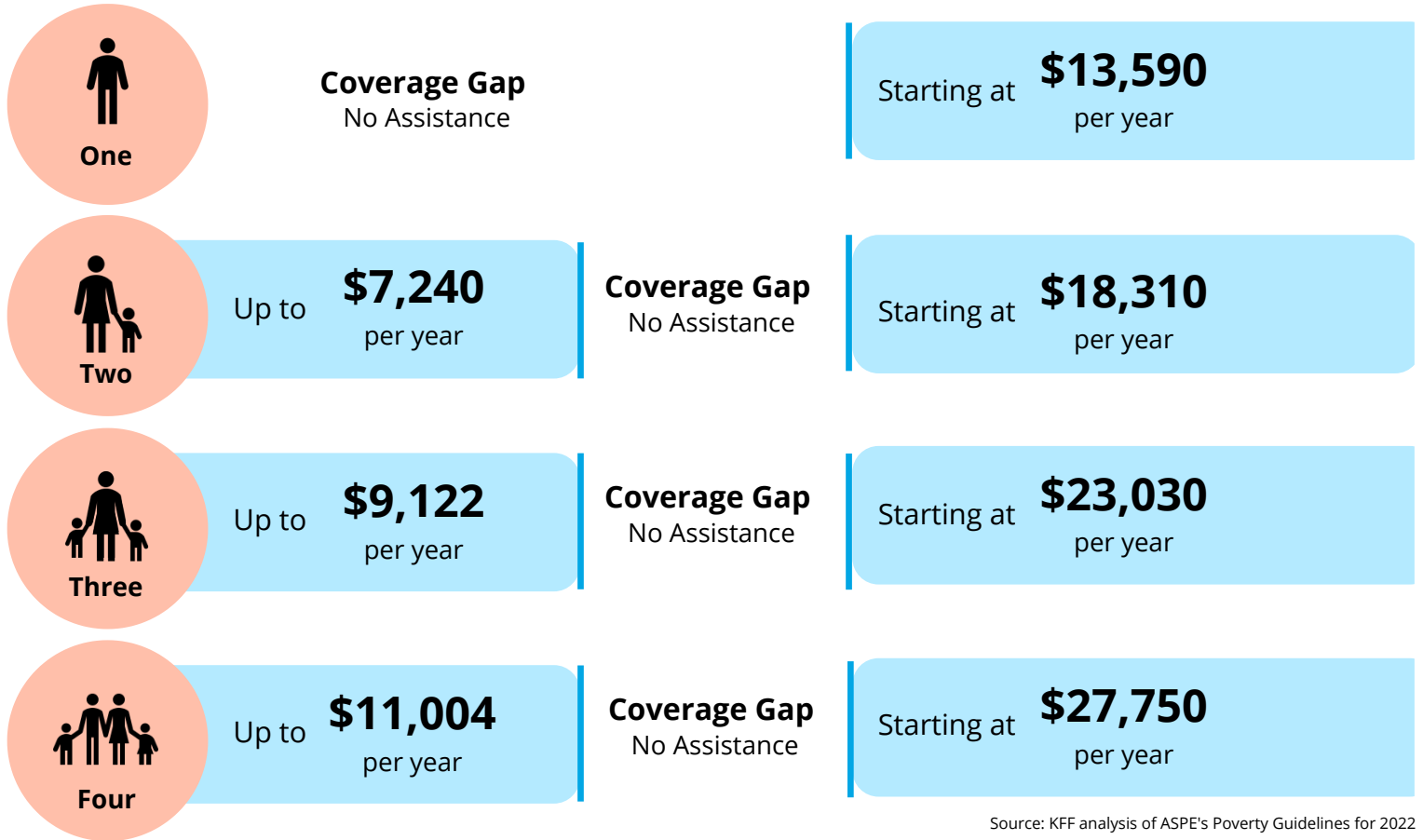

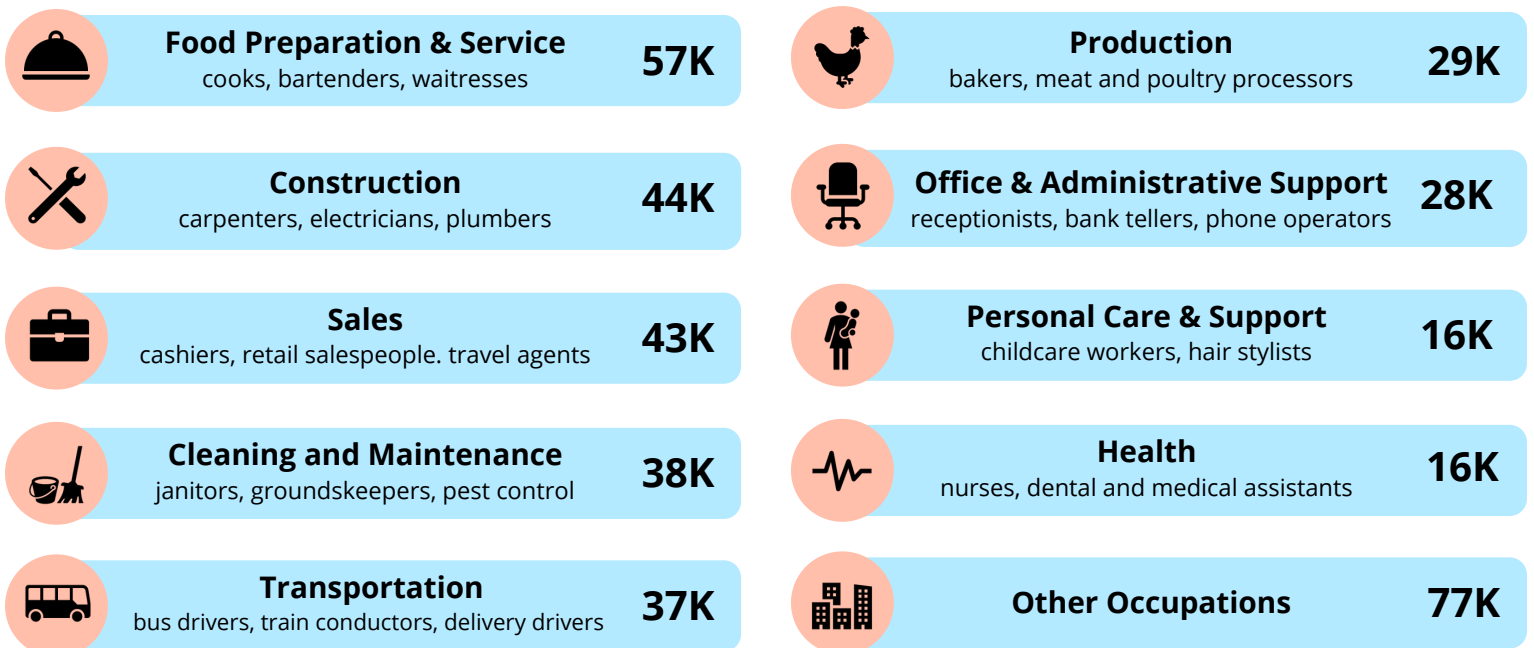
Marketplace Subsidy
